What Can Clinical Pharmacists Contribute to the GP Team?
48% of adult patients take at least one prescribed medication¹, pharmacists, as medicines experts are streamlining practice prescription processes, medicines optimisation, minor ailments, & long term condition management.

NHS England Programme - Clinical Pharmacists in General Practice NHSE is continuing to invest in GP clinical pharmacists, pledging funding for three years to recruit, train & establish clinical pharmacists in your general practice. Dorset practices have already benefitted from the programme & recent changes have made it easier to apply.
