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# Guest Speakers



## Dr Stuart Carney

- Deputy National Director of the UK Foundation Programme Office;
- Senior Clinical Advisor, Medical Education and Training Programme, Department of Health (England); and
- Associate Dean for Quality, Oxford Deanery.

Stuart has been involved in the development and implementation of the UK Foundation Programme for the last 7 years. Appointed to the Department of Health in 2004, he helped to manage the implementation of reforms to the first two years of postgraduate training and also served as Foundation School Director in the South of the East Midlands. Since 2008, as Deputy National Director, he has lead the delivery of the Foundation Programme Curriculum across the UK and Malta and championed the provision of academic training opportunities for those considering a career in research, management or teaching.

A graduate of Edinburgh University Medical School and the Harvard University School of Public Health, he trained in Psychiatry at Oxford. As a trainee, he became interested in education, was a founder member of Academy of Medical Educators and now serves as Registrar.



## Dr Vicky Osgood

Dr Vicky Osgood is Assistant Director of Postgraduate Education at the General Medical Council where she is responsible for the approval and quality assurance of the content, standards and outcomes of postgraduate medical education and training in the UK.

From 2008 until 2011 she was Postgraduate Dean for Wessex. Prior to that, she worked as a Consultant in Obstetrics and as Director of Postgraduate Medical Education in a large NHS trust. From 2005-2008 she was the medical advisor to the Workforce Review Team and was involved in many aspects of workforce planning in the NHS in England.



## Dr Elizabeth Hughes

Dr Elizabeth Hughes is the West Midlands Regional Postgraduate Dean responsible for the training of over 5000 junior doctors throughout the West Midlands Region. She has been involved with education for many years in the West Midlands.

She is Director of the Sandwell Medical Research Unit, a leading UK centre for research into diabetes and heart disease particularly focusing on research on cardiovascular risk in the South Asian Community on which she has published widely.

Dr Liz Hughes is also a Consultant in Chemical Pathology and Metabolic Medicine at Sandwell General Hospital, West Bromwich and Honorary Associate Professor at the University of Warwick. She is also a Trustee and Board Member of HEART UK and has for many years worked with the patient's committee at HEART UK.
