### Wessex Safety, Quality & Improvement Conference – October 2018

Health Education England (Wessex) and the Wessex Patient Safety Collaborative welcomed over 200 delegates to their third annual conference in October.

Delegates enjoyed some excellent keynote sessions including Roy Lilley who made reference to the importance of positive deviance and the importance of sharing all the good work taking place within the NHS, Dr Chris Turner (Emergency Medicine Consultant from West Midlands) speaking on civility reminding delegates that how we behave towards each other is the single greatest factor in how well competent teams perform, Lt Col Tania Cubison (Burns and Reconstructive Surgeon, East Grinstead) talking about the 'operational theatre' and the importance of training teams to behave like teams, and Cara Charles-Barks (Chief Executive) sharing her insights from leading Salisbury NHS FT through a turbulent year this year.

Delegates also had the opportunity to attend a workshop to hear about the work of the HEE Wessex School of Quality Improvement and the opportunities and impact it has or a workshop on the work being led by Wessex Q's. A poster display and competition was also on offer for delegates.

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### **Quality Improvement Support Fund 2018/19**

New for this year has been our Quality Improvement Support Fund. Bids were welcomed from across Wessex to support either:

- 1. A healthcare issue linked to one of the following areas, and which will use improvement methodology and tools as a key component of the work: Care of people who are frail; Cancer Care; Maternity, children and young people; Mental Health; Primary Care; Public Health; or Urgent and Emergency Care.
- 2. The development or continuing professional development of the workforce in quality improvement (this could be on an individual, team or organisational basis)

Funding is to be utilised between September 2018 – September 2019 (although the piece of work or development may not span this entire period). Following a formal process and panel review, we are delighted that funding has been awarded to 14 bids. We look forward to hearing about their progress throughout the year and when they present their work at a celebration event in autumn 2019.

### Health Education England Commission on Education & Training for Patient Safety

The Commission was set up by HEE to focus on how education and training interventions can actively improve patient safety. The Commission gathered evidence through focus groups, interviews, regional visits and online surveys; from patients and their families, carers, students and trainees, frontline staff and executives, as well as sought the views of international experts and national organisations. The final report can be accessed <a href="here">here</a>.

The report made 12 recommendations to HEE and the wider system. HEE is progressing this work across its regions via a national network group to ensure that its responsibilities to patient safety are met. The School sits on this group.
