# Wessex Safety, Quality and Improvement Conference

Health Education England (Wessex) and the Wessex Academic Health Science Network Patient Safety Team were delighted to welcome over 220 delegates to the 4th annual Wessex Safety, Quality and Improvement Conference on 8 October 2019 in Southampton. The theme for this year is 'Safety, Quality and the NHS Long Term Plan: What does this mean for you?'

Delegates enjoyed some excellent keynote sessions including Aidan Fowler (National Patient Safety Director NHSE/I) who expanded on details on the national Patient Safety Strategy, Pauline Brown (Regional Chief Nurse, HEE South) who delivered an update on HEE's role with the Patient Safety Strategy/syllabus, and a very impactful session from Alison Phillips on her experience as a deteriorating patient. New for this year were a number of 3-minute/1 slide presentations of local work selected via the conference call for abstracts process.

Delegates also had the opportunity to attend two breakout sessions which covered a number of aspects of local work linked to patient safety, quality and improvement. A poster display and competition was also on offer for delegates alongside some innovators sharing their work.

# Appreciative Inquiry 2-day 'Taste of Al' course and 3-day course for Advanced Al Practitioners

The vast majority of the time healthcare is safe and delivers high quality care to patients. We sometimes lose sight of this in the Patient Safety world where we focus on what went wrong. The 2-day course aims to look at Safety II, when things go well, so that we may capture this learning. The themes and practice are widely applicable to the workplace and healthcare. We have recently run two cohorts of the 2-day programme in conjunction with Appreciating People, which is aimed at Wessex healthcare professionals working in safety and/or improvement. A 3-day advanced practitioner course will support participants to apply their knowledge and practice in their work. Attendance at the foundation level course or equivalent learning would be expected.

### **HEE Patient Safety Repository**

In response to the recommendations made in the 2016 report 'Improving Safety Through Education & Training', Health Education England have developed a new patient safety resource. This is based on the four strategic elements that make up HEE's 'In Safe Hands' initiative and includes human factors, simulation, learning and development and speaking up. Content will be updated and added to as work in patient safety is progressed.

#### **NHS Patient Safety Strategy and Syllabus**

A national Patient Safety Strategy was launched in July 2019 and sets out what the NHS will do to achieve its vision to continuously improve patient safety. Included within this is the development of the first ever system wide Patient Safety Syllabus, making education available to all staff. This will include an e-learning programme for all staff in the Foundations of Patient Safety. HEE is leading this development, with an aim for the programme to be available by April 2021. HEE will work with education providers to integrate this work within existing and new educational programme for NHS staff.
