Guest Speakers



Mr Harry Cayton CBE

Harry Cayton is Chief Executive of the Professional Standards Authority for Health and Social Care, the statutory body which oversees the regulation and registration of health and care professions in the UK. From 2001-2007 he was National Director for Patients & the Public at the Department of Health following 20 years in the voluntary sector, latterly as Chief Executive of the Alzheimer's Society. From 2003-2013 he was an advisor to Macmillan Cancer Support. In 2014 he was appointed to the Press Regulation Recognition Panel established under Royal Charter following the Leveson Inquiry. He is a trustee of Comic Relief and chair of its UK Grants Committee. Harry is a Patron of Arts4Dementia. He received a Fellowship through Distinction from the Faculty of Public Health in 2007. He was made an OBE in 2002 for services to people with dementia, and a CBE in 2014 for services to health and regulation reform.



Mr Peter Lees

Peter Lees is the Chief Executive and Medical Director of the UK intercollegiate Faculty of Medical Leadership and Management.

Over 20 years, he combined a career in neurosurgery with senior roles in operational management and leadership development. This included experience at local, regional and national levels and in global health. Formerly he was Medical Director, Director of Workforce and Education and Director of Leadership at NHS South Central Strategic Health Authority and Senior Lecturer in Neurosurgery at the University of Southampton.

He is a graduate of Manchester and Southampton Universities, a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England and a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians, London.



Professor Ian Curran

Professor Ian Curran is the Assistant Director of Education and Standards at the General Medical Council where he leads the work in postgraduate medical education and training.

He previously worked at Barts Healthcare NHS Trust where he was a Consultant Anaesthetist with a special interest in chronic pain management. He was Clinical Academic Group Director of Education & Workforce at Barts, Senior Examiner for Medical Finals at Barts School of Medicine and Dentistry and Professor of Innovation and Excellence in Healthcare Education at Queen Mary University of London.

Previously Professor Curran was Postgraduate Dean of Educational Excellence in London from 2010-13 where he led London's multi-award winning Simulation and Technology enhanced Learning Initiative. He has also been a Clinical Adviser to the Department of Health, NHS England and NHS Health Education England.



Karen Baker

Karen has been the Chief Executive at the Isle of Wight NHS Trust for the last three years. The Trust is the only integrated provider for acute, community, mental health and ambulance health care in England and provides a full range of health services to an isolated offshore population of 140,000. The Trust in conjunction with local partners is one of the Vanguard sites for NHS England's New Models of Care Programme and works collaboratively with the Clinical Commissioning Group, Local Authority, Voluntary Sector, Housing and Care Homes towards an integrated Primary and Acute Care System (PACS). The Island location can be a workforce challenge and Health Education Wessex plays a key role in remodelling the workforce for the future to ensure the sustainability of local services.

I am a GP and partner at The Grove Surgery Christchurch.

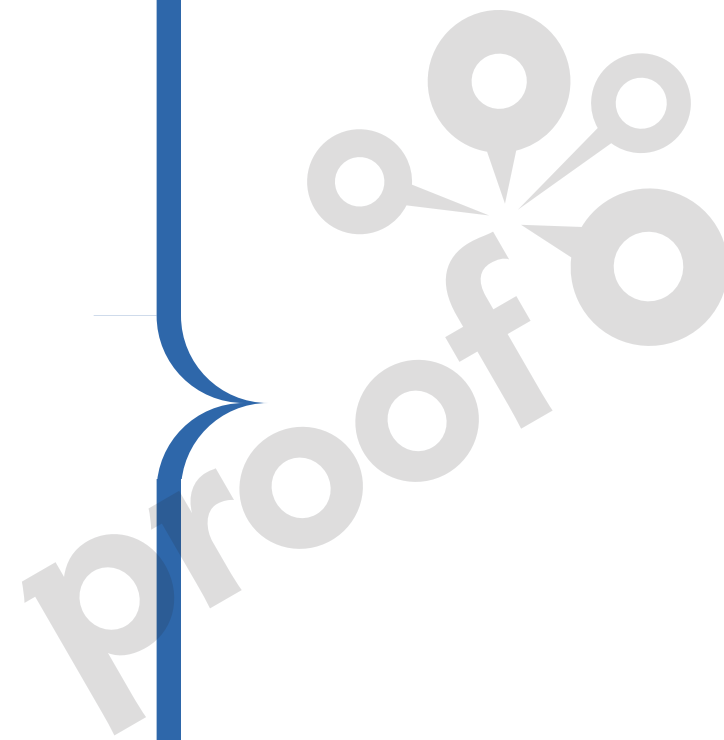
Program Director for GP training in Dorset.
