Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, inequalities in health have become magnified amongst people from Black, Asian and minority ethnic backgrounds.

This project takes on board recommendation 2 of the [Beyond the Data](#) report by 'supporting community participatory research, in which researchers and community stakeholders engage as equal partners'

In 2021, 40 community researchers from Black, Asian and minority ethnic communities were trained and mentored to undertake research in their communities.

This event will bring together the researchers, community members and strategic partners to share their work; learn from the implementation of the projects and use this event as an opportunity to promote the research to directly impact health outcomes.

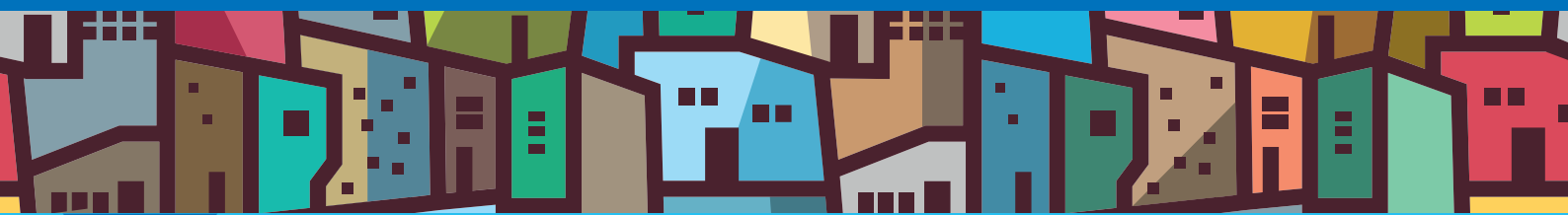
