#### AP

- level 5 qualification
- Accelerated progression on prereg programme

## **Clinical Support Worker CSW** Typically band 2 **Senior Clinical Support Worker SCSW** typically Band 3 **Mammography Associate Practitioner** MAP typically Band 4 **Assistant Practitioner AP** typically Band 4 Registered practitioner/radiographer Typically band 5

## Clinical support worker

- Enables effective patient care and undertakes important clerical, administrative and housekeeping tasks to support the delivery of diagnostic imaging services
- Care certificate, level 2 qualification, functional skills
  - Maintaining a clean and safe environment
  - Managing stock and consumables
  - Managing data
  - Managing paperwork/documentation
  - Supporting communication and providing effective liaison
  - Supporting patient care
  - Supporting examinations

## Senior clinical support worker

- All the above ...
- ...plus clinical support and patient care before, during and after diagnostic imaging examinations

#### Profession specific education, functional skills

- Supporting patients and staff: appointing/reporting systems, pathway knowledge
- Equipment related tasks: basic QA, decontamination of mobile machines, changing MRI coils, preparing rooms
- Communicating/Liaising beyond the imaging team
- Supporting Patient flow
- Supporting specific examinations: preparing equipment, disposing of equipment, supporting aseptic procedures, preparing patients, patient observations, aftercare
- Support medicines management
- Support education and training

## Mammography associate

- Defined and limited scope of practice in mammography
- qualified to work within the breast imaging workforce,
- routine two-view mammography
- under the supervision of a registered radiographer mammographer

## Assistant practitioner


Supports clinical service delivery by performing non-complex protocol-driven clinical diagnostic imaging examinations under the supervision of a registered radiographer.

- Profession specific level 5 qualification
  - Narrow and a well-defined scope of practice
  - Imaging examinations delegated and supervised
  - Patient care
  - QA/QC
  - Regulations/legislation
  - Radiation protection, dose management and safety procedures
  - Image management
  - Leadership
  - Education and training

### The differences between Assistant Practitioners & Diagnostic Radiographers

| Practice<br>area    | Assistant practitioner   | Diagnostic radiographer   |
|---------------------|--|---|
| Scope of practice   | Narrow and limited to standard protocols   | Broad across range of diagnostic radiography<br>techniques/ specialised in area of practice, with<br>depth of knowledge                       |
| Patient type        | Co-operative patients  | All patients  |
| Decision-<br>making | Follows protocols and standard operating procedures – escalates to diagnostic radiographer where outside scope or protocol | Makes decisions and guides assistant practitioner where decisions fall outside their scope of practice, such as urgent or unexpected findings |
| Supervision         | Works under supervision of diagnostic radiographer   | Supervises assistant practitioner and works in own supervisory framework as autonomous practitioner   |


