How does county lines impact on vulnerable adults in the Dorset Council area?

Risk factors identified:


- Opiate users
- Cuckooed addresses
- Pharmacies
- Temporary properties & HMOs
- Troubled families
- Adults with a learning disability
- Railway stations

Objective: to identify vulnerable locations and inform people who are working within those communities to recognise and spot potential victims



Location of people in treatment for opiate use (by LSOA) 2018-19

(LSOAs with less than 6 have been suppressed - unmet treatment need for opiates and crack cocaine is 43.7%)


Dorset County Lines Partnership Project - Locations vulnerable to exploitation



Key Findings



- A high proportion of victims are likely to be known to substance misuse services and many are in contact with other professionals.
- Exploitation of adults for county lines exists in all of the main towns across the Dorset Council area.
- Adults are at risk if they live within walking distance of a main train station.





Resulting Actions

- 1. Use the risk matrix to focus county lines awareness to specific groups and organisations that come into contact with vulnerable adults.
- 2. Conduct a deep dive to ascertain why the Bridport area appears to be an outlier.
- Work closely with substance misuse keyworkers to identify any other clients who might be victims of cuckooing.
